A Samaritan Shows Compassion

WHAT'S THE POINT?

God showed great <u>compassion</u> toward us when He sent His Son, Jesus, to provide a way for us to be in relationship with Him. Romans 5:8 says "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Jesus was a living example of the Father's <u>compassion</u> as He taught, fed and healed the people. Jesus gave His very life for us. He wanted us to understand that we are commanded to treat others with <u>compassion</u> because He was first <u>compassionate</u> toward us.

Jesus taught us who we were to be <u>compassionate</u> toward... our neighbors. Then He told us who our neighbors are. We are commanded to show <u>compassion</u> to those we know, those who are in need, and those we do not know. Furthermore, He told us to show <u>compassion</u> to those who may be our enemy. May we come to understand that with God's help, we can choose to show <u>compassion</u> for others.

GET CONNECTED



Building relationships in Surf Teams; introducing today's lesson.

Memory Link cards, Hang 10 pages, index cards, pen, highlighters

Use the following conversation prompts to get to know the kids in your Surf Team and to introduce today's lesson.

- Today's character word is compassion. What does compassion mean to you?
- Have you ever had a broken bone or been badly hurt? Did you need <u>compassion</u> in that moment?
- Why does a person who is hurt need compassion?
- How can you show <u>compassion</u> to others?
- How does it make you feel when you show <u>compassion</u> to others?

Guide students to locate and mark today's Bible Connection and Memory Link in their Bibles so they can find the pages quickly as directed in the session.

Worship Tip

The love and <u>compassion</u> that we show others is a product of the love and <u>compassion</u> God has shown us. Look for songs that tell about God's love for us. After the song, ask kids to share what the song said about God's love.

MEMORY LINK



Teach a Bible verse to students; help them memorize the verse.

No supplies needed

Focus on the Bible 🛄

Every Memory Link is a verse in the Bible. Today's Memory Link is found in John 15:12. So, what is the name of the book? (John) What is the chapter? (15) What is the verse? (12). Page numbers can help you find verses, too. Today's verse is found on page 1172. Now, you will do a drill with your Bibles. I will say "page 1172... go!" On "go," you will open your Bible and quickly find the page. Once you have found the page, stand up. Make sure all the kids have their Bibles closed and say "go." Repeat a few times with the goal of more kids being able to find the page in the time allotted.

Focus on today's Memory Link 📖

Listen carefully as I read the Memory Link. Read the verse aloud. Who is talking in this verse? (Jesus) What does the word commandment mean? (laws given by God) Does the word commandment mean that you can choose to follow it only if you want? No, a commandment means we must obey. Jesus commands us to love one another.

One way we can love others is by being <u>compassionate</u>. When we help others without expecting anything in return, we love like Jesus commanded. The lesson today is about a man who showed <u>compassion</u> to someone who was hurt. Others had passed the hurt man without helping, but one man chose to show <u>compassion</u>.

Option 1 - BANDAGE ME UP

Adhesive bandages

Guide each Surf Team to sit in a circle. Give a bandage to one student in the circle. Ask the students to pass the bandage as they say one word of the Memory Link. The student who says the last word gets to put the bandage on. Hand another bandage to a kid and start again. If the last word is said by someone who already has a bandage, that person will give the bandage to someone without one. Play continues until all students receive a bandage.

Option 2 - ROCK, PAPER, SCISSORS

No supplies needed

Ask two students to come to the front and demonstrate how to play Rock, Paper, Scissors. Point out that they will count to three, then show rock, paper or scissors. Explain that rock beats scissors, scissors beats paper and paper beats rock. Instruct the kids to find a partner, play three times, then switch to a new partner. Tell them that the winner of each game must say the Memory Link. Play continues until time is called. John 15:12 "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." (KBC Study Bible pg. 1172)

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Teaching Tip

Don't know how to play Rock, Paper, Scissors? The kids will! If you want the details or a refresher before club, just search the Internet. The rules will be easy to find. And you may find a few variations on play, especially for groups.

BIBLE CONNECTION



Teaching today's Character Word through gospel-centered Bible story.

Resource item, fruit snacks, two pool noodles, bag of coins, robe, bandages

Prepare

Before the session, select seven children to act out the story. Give each actor the corresponding "actor sign" (Resources) for his role and explain what each will do during the story. Ask the traveler to put on the robe and give him the pool noodle to use as a stick horse and the bag of coins. Give the Samaritan the other pool noodle to use as a stick horse and bandages.

Introduce the Story

As Jesus performed miracles and taught people about God, His popularity grew. Many people came to listen to Him teach and to ask Him questions. If you could ask Jesus a question, what would you ask Him? Direct the kids to raise their hands and select a few to state the question they might ask Jesus. Today's story is about a man who asked Jesus a question. Jesus answered by telling a story. Let's find what happened by reading it in the Bible.

Luke 10:25-29 🛄

Guide the kids to open their KBC Study Bibles to Luke 10:25-29 (page 1122). Ask a volunteer to find Luke 10:25 and read the question. (What shall I do to inherit eternal life?) Ask a different volunteer to read Luke 10:26 to discover how Jesus responded. (What is written in the law?) *In other words, when the man asked Jesus how to have eternal life in heaven with God, Jesus said that the answer is found in God's word, the Bible.* Ask a third volunteer to read Luke 10:27 to find the man's interpretation of scripture. *This man knew the Bible said that the way to a relationship with God was to love God and love others. Jesus complimented the man that he said correctly what the Bible taught. Then the man asked another question.* Ask a fourth volunteer to read the question in Luke 10:29. (Who is my neighbor?)

Talk About It

Ask the kids how they might answer the question, "Who is your neighbor?" (Allow for responses.) The man talking with Jesus knew God's law said to love your neighbor as yourself. He also knew he didn't want to love everyone. Show the kids the fruit snack package. It's a little like eating these fruit snacks. Take out a fruit snack and eat them one at a time, making one of the following statements each time. 1) Oh good! My favorite. I love you. 2) I don't really like you, but you're OK. 3) I'm not eating you because you're disgusting. Put the snack away and continue. Maybe you know people who treat others like fruit snacks. They love some people and hate others.

Set Up the Drama

So Jesus told a story to answer the question, "Who is my neighbor?" You'll see the story acted out today. Introduce the actors and explain who they will be portraying. Tell the story, pausing appropriately for your actors to act out the story verse by verse. Give the actors prompts as needed.

Luke 10:30-35

One day there was a Jewish man traveling from Jerusalem to Jericho. (Pause.) Suddenly, thieves attacked the man. (Pause) They beat the man, took his horse, robe and gold, and left him half dead. But wait, here comes a Jewish priest. The

Teaching Tip

Make it a point to have your Bible visible while you tell the story. This offers kids a visual understanding that what you are teaching comes from God's word. You can use sticky notes or have your lesson page inside your Bible. If you usually bring your KBC Bible, occasionally bring your personal Bible from home.

Teaching Tip

Since fruit snacks are used to illustrate part of today's story, you may want to provide fruit snacks for your students. Encourage them to save the fruit snacks to eat when they get home and use it to explain to their families what they learned today about treating others with <u>compassion</u>. priest is a man who works in the temple of God. Surely he will have compassion and help. The priest saw the man, but he passed by on the other side, far away from the injured man. (Pause) Then a Levite came along. This is another man who is Jewish and who knew God's word. Surely he will have compassion and help. The Levite went and looked at the man then went on the other side just like the priest did. Tell the 'Levite' to walk across, away from hurt traveler. (Pause) Oh, no! This man is a Samaritan. Samaritans and Jews don't get along. They didn't talk to each other or even touch each other. There's no way that he will have <u>compassion</u> and help. But this man didn't pass by on the other side. He saw the man, and stopped to help. He bandaged the injured man and put him on his own horse and took him to the Innkeeper. Direct the 'Samaritan' to help the traveler and take him to the innkeeper. (Pause) He gave the innkeeper money to take care of the hurt man and told him that he would pay him back if he needed to spend any more money to help the traveler get well. (Pause) Ask the actors to come to the front, take a bow and remain at the front of the teaching area as you finish the story.

Luke 10:36-37 🛄

After Jesus told this story, He asked a question. Ask a volunteer to read Luke 10:36 to find the question Jesus asked. (Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to him who fell among the thieves?) *Everyone point to the person who showed compassion.* Yes, it was the Samaritan.

Look at Luke 10:37b on page 1123. What did Jesus tell the man asking the questions to do? (Go and do likewise.) That's right, Jesus told him to go and do the same. That means to treat others with <u>compassion</u>, like the Good Samaritan did.

Gospel Connection

Do you remember the first question the man asked Jesus? (What must I do to inherit eternal life?) The Bible tells us that we are separated from God because of sin. But God is full of <u>compassion</u>. God showed us <u>compassion</u> when He sent Jesus to our world. The Bible tells us we were dead in our sins when Jesus came to die for us and take our sins away. Jesus brings healing to the hurt that sin causes. We must ADMIT we have sinned and ASK Jesus to forgive us. If we BELIEVE that Jesus came to save us by dying on the cross and CHOOSE TO FOLLOW Jesus by saying out loud that Jesus is our Savior and Lord, we become part of God's family. If you want to talk with someone about becoming part of God's family, tell your surf team leader.

Close with a prayer. Thank you God for showing compassion to us and sending Jesus to take away our sins.

Invite students wanting to know more about praying to ask Jesus to be their forever friend to move to the designated counseling area to talk with a leader one on one. Be sure to have all the decision supplies available.

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Gospel Tip

The best way to determine the authenticity of a child's decision is by observing changes over time. Is there an increased desire for the things of God? Do you see ongoing conviction and repentance of sin? Is there evidence of the development of the Fruit of the Spirit? These things can only be seen in the weeks and months following a decision. Patiently cultivate gospel seeds in kids. Pray for those seeds to fall on the good soil, grow deep roots of faith and bear fruit of the Spirit.

SURF TEAM TIME

Connecting with kids in small groups; applying today's Bible Connection and Character Word.

Gospel Connection

Before you begin, ask if there are any students who would like to talk with the Bible Connection leader about praying to ask Jesus to become their forever friend. If so, let them go to the designated area.

Today's Lesson

- What questions do you have about today's story?
- In the story, why was it so surprising when the Samaritan helped the man who was hurt?
- What did you learn from Jesus in the story about who is your neighbor?
- How does Jesus show compassion to us?
- How can you show compassion to others?

Use the Bible

Give each child a memory link card. Review today's memory link and character word. Guide kids to use cards to mark today's story in their KBC Study Bibles. Lead them to highlight today's memory link.

Hang 10 Pages

Give each child a Hang 10 Page. Challenge kids to hang out with God 10 minutes each day by praying and reading the Bible, using the Hang 10 page as a guide. Encourage kids to bring back their Hang 10 pages next week.

Read the story of the Good Samaritan to your siblings at home. Lead them to act it out with you. Then, with your parents permission, meet a neighbor and do one act of compassion toward them.

Pray

Explain that praying for others is an excellent way to show <u>compassion</u>. Guide kids to choose a partner. Direct partners to share one prayer request with each other and pray for each other. Encourage the kids to write prayer requests on index cards. Take the cards home and pray for kids requests during the week.

Father God, I thank You that You love us too much to leave us in our sin. Thank You for sending Jesus to take away our sin. In Jesus' name, amen.

Teaching Tip

Kids love mail. This week, send cards to the kids in your Surf Team letting them know you're thinking of them. Include an encouraging verse of scripture for kids to read in their Bibles. Remember to include the page number to help kids find the verse in their KBC Study Bible. Sending cards at special times reminds kids how much you care about them.

MAKE IT STICK - REVIEW GAME

Game to review today's Bible Connection and Character Word



Option 1 - WOUNDED TRAVELER RELAY

One or two slings made from strips of cloth

Divide your Surf Team into two smaller teams, or play one Surf Team against another. Give the first person in each line a sling to wear around her neck and arm. On a signal, the first person in each line puts on the sling and hops on one foot to a spot you indicate, about 10-15 feet away and back. The first person to return gets to answer a question. Repeat with the next person continuing until everyone has a chance to race and all questions have been answered. You may wish to repeat the race without the questions if time permits.

Option 2 - COMPASSION STATEMENT

Cones

Instruct Surf Teams to line up single file. The Surf Team leader will ask a question. Upon their signal, the student runs around the cone and back to the end of their line and sits down. However, before the signal, the first person in line must speak a sincere compliment showing compassion to the person next in line behind them.

REVIEW QUESTIONS

- 1. What is today's Character Word? (Compassion)
- 2. How can you show compassion? (Answers may vary)
- 3. What was the first question the man asked Jesus? (What shall I do to inherit eternal life?)
- 4. What happened to the Jewish man as he traveled along the road? (Robbers beat him up.)
- 5. When the priest and the Levite came by what did they do? (They walked to the other side of the road and did not stop to help.)
- 6. Who stopped and helped the injured man and why was this surprising? (The Samaritan; because Jews and Samaritans didn't like each other)
- 7. At the end of the story, what did Jesus command? (Go and do likewise.)
- 8. Based on what Jesus taught, who is your neighbor? (Anyone who needs my <u>compassion</u> or help)
- 9. Besides helping the man there on the road what else did the Samaritan do to help? (He took him to an inn, gave the innkeeper money and said he would pay him back if it cost more)
- 10. Today's lesson is from what part of the Bible? (New Testament)

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Teaching Tip

No matter what role you play in Beach Club — pray! Ask God to empower you, through His Holy Spirit, to understand the lesson and to be able to communicate it. Pray that God will bless the kids in each Surf Team. Let your students know you pray for them and ask them to share prayer requests.

Teaching Tip

If you have a student who tends to disrupt the group, consider making them a leader. Give them the activity instructions ahead of time and help them lead the other students to successfully complete the activity.
