Adam and Eve Sin

WHAT'S THE POINT?

While "sin" is an unpopular word in today's world, it is a critical Biblical concept. Only those who take <u>responsibility</u> for their actions will recognize sin in their life, and only those people will feel a need for the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

Adam and Eve chose to disobey God. They both refused to accept the <u>responsibility</u> and blamed someone else. We do the same thing. We minimize our <u>responsibilities</u> and blame our problems on others or on our circumstances.

Thankfully, we have a Creator who loves us even in our sin. He provided a way for us to be rescued from the separation from Him caused by our sin. Romans 5:10 says, "For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life." God sent Jesus to take the <u>responsibility</u> for that reconciliation. Admitting our sin is the first step toward reconciliation. Once we are reconciled to Him, we can then walk with God as Adam and Eve once did.

GET CONNECTED



Building relationships in Surf Teams; introducing today's lesson.

Worship Tip

Consider making a list of 4-5 songs that you will rotate through this year at KBC. Make a CD or give the songlist to your KBC leaders. Make posters with the words to each song. When the leaders are familiar with the songs and feel confident to sing them using the lyric posters, it sets a confident tone in the room for worship. This atmosphere will allow the clubbers to feel more assured as they listen and learn the songs. Planning ahead and making preparations will enhance your worship time.

Teaching a Bible verse to clubbers; helping them memorize the verse

No supplies needed

Prepare

Think about something you bought recently that came with instructions. Use that as an example below.

I recently bought a new ______. When I unpacked it, inside was a booklet. This book was written by the company that made my ______ and it tells me how to use and take care of my ______. It also tells me what to do if something goes wrong. This book (hold up a KBC Study Bible) is an instruction book for people. It is the word of God, our Creator. The Bible tells me how to love God and love others. It also tells me what to do when things go wrong. Wow! What a wonderful book! I think everyone needs a Bible. How many of you brought your Bible with you today? In a few weeks, everyone who has not received a KBC Bible before will get one!

Focus on today's Memory Link 📖

Invite kids to find Romans 3:23 in their Bibles (KBC Study Bibles, page 1233). Ask a volunteer to read the verse aloud. Draw kids' attention to "Digging In" at the bottom of page 1233. Use that as a discussion point to talk with kids about sin. *Sin is breaking God's law. It is doing things our way instead of God's way. 'All' means everyone. Everyone has a problem of sin. In the second part of the verse it says that we 'fall short' of the glory of God. Think of trying to shoot a basket in basketball and your ball doesn't even get near the basket. In today's story, Adam and Eve sinned and did not take <u>responsibility</u> for their actions. They were no longer perfect as God had created them. Their actions "fell short' of God's best. Since then, all people are born in sin and continue to 'fall short' of God's best.*

Option 1 - ACT IT OUT

Timer

Use these motions to teach the verse. *For all* (point in a sweeping motion from left to right) *have sinned* (pretend to break a stick over knee) *and fall* (raise one hand above head and bring down quickly) *short* (use two hands separated by 4 inches) *of the glory* (move both arms in a big circle) *of God* (point upward). For an extra challenge, time the students to see how many times can they act out the verse in one minute.

Option 2 - PICK UP THEN LAY DOWN

Beach balls, timer

Instruct clubbers to pass the beach ball around the circle to one another while saying a word in the verse. Keep the ball moving around the circle until the verse and reference has been repeated. Play a few times until the kids have memorized the verse. For an extra challenge, time the kids to see how fast they can say the verse while passing the beach ball. LESSON 3 "RESPONSIBILITY" (page 3)

Teaching today's character word through gospel-centered Bible story.

No supplies needed

Introduce the Story

Today's story is in the first book of the Bible, Genesis. The first words of the Bible are "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." When God made the world He just spoke the words and things happened. God created everything and everything He made was not just OK; it was perfect. God created a perfect world. And then He created two people. Do you know who they were? (Adam and Eve) In Genesis, we find that God created Adam and Eve in His image, which means they were perfect. He gave them a beautiful place to live called the Garden of Eden. The Bible tells us that in this special place God would come and walk with Adam and Eve. Can you imagine being in a garden and walking with God? Adam and Eve had absolutely everything they needed in the garden. The only rule that God gave to them was not to eat of the tree that stood in the center of the garden. All they had to do was be <u>responsible</u> and follow one rule.

Genesis 3:1-6

Into this perfect garden came a serpent. One day the serpent asked Eve, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden?'" Eve answered him, "No. We can eat from the trees in the garden. We just can't eat from the tree in the middle of the garden because God said, 'Don't eat from it; don't even touch it or you'll die.'" The serpent then told Eve, "You won't die. God knows that the moment you eat from that tree, you will be like God and you will know everything good and evil.." Hmmm... Eve looked at the tree again (tap chin in a thinking motion) and saw that it would be good for food. She could know everything that God knew. (Stare longingly as thinking) Would she be responsible and obey God's rules or not? Remember what sin is? Yes, sin is breaking God's law. Eve decided to eat the fruit and she gave it to Adam to eat also. Oh No! Now both of them had sinned! What will happen?

Read Genesis 3:7-8

Ask a volunteer to read Genesis 3:7-8 aloud (page 5) while the other kids follow along in their Bibles. *Immediately, Adam and Eve changed. They looked at each other and saw that they were both naked, so they made clothes for themselves.* Before, they were made perfect in God's image.

Talk About It

When you disobey your parents, how do you feel? (sad, ashamed) Do you ever try to hide or avoid your parent because you know you will be in trouble? That's what Adam and Eve did. The Bible says Adam and Eve heard God walking in the garden. But now they didn't want to walk with Him. They knew they had sinned so they hurried to hide from Him. Sin had caused all these changes. Their relationship with their Creator was broken.

Read Genesis 3:9-13

Ask a volunteer to read Genesis 3:9-13 aloud (page 5) while the other kids follow along in their Bibles. God called to Adam, "Where are you?" Adam answered and said, "I heard You in the garden and I was afraid because I am naked, so I hid from You." God answered, "Who told you that you were naked? Did you eat

Teaching Tip

Interact with kids as you tell the story. Pause during the story for short discussion. Do not let a child's question derail your story and remember you don't always have to call on every child who raises his or her hand. from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from?" Now Adam and Eve had a chance to take <u>responsibility</u> for their actions. But Adam decided to blame Eve. Then Eve blamed the serpent. Both Adam and Eve sinned, but did you notice that neither of them took <u>responsibility</u>?

Talk About It

Adam and Eve did not take <u>responsibility</u> for their actions. They blamed each other for the choices they made. Don't we often do the same thing today? Rather than owning up to our sin, we cast blame on someone else to make ourselves look better. But God knows the truth. We all are sinners.

Genesis 3:14-24

Sin always has a consequence. God punished the serpent for deceiving Eve. From now on the serpent would be the lowest of all the animals, would crawl on his belly and eat dust all the days of his life. Then God punished Eve and told her she would now have pain when she gave birth and her husband would be in authority over her. God also punished Adam. Adam and Eve had to leave the garden of Eden and from now on Adam would have to get food the hard way: planting, tilling, harvesting and sweating in the field. They all suffered consequences for choosing to disobey God's law. And it is the same today. Sin always has consequences.

Gospel Connection

Our memory link today says that all people sin. We all say or do things that are against God's law. Sin separates us from God. But because we have such a loving and forgiving God, we have hope. Our hope is in Jesus Christ. The Bible tells us in John 3:16 that God loved us so much that He gave His one and only Son, Jesus, to die in the place of (take <u>responsibility</u> for) our sins and that whoever believes in Him will live with Him forever. Jesus wants to be your Forever Friend! When you invite Jesus to become your forever friend, then God makes you one of His children. The Bible says that you must ADMIT that you are a sinner and ask Jesus to forgive your sins. You can BELIEVE that Jesus' sacrifice on the cross paid the price for those sins. Finally, CHOOSE TO FOLLOW Jesus by confessing Him as your Savior and Lord.

Application/Transition

Invite children wanting to know more about becoming a Christian to move to the designated counseling area to meet with a leader one-on-one.

At the beginning of this lesson Adam and Eve lived in a perfect place with God. That sounds so wonderful, doesn't it? That is what Jesus wants for His forever friends. He wants us to live with Him in eternity forever.

Gospel Tip

The Gospel Connection is vital each week. Be sure to connect each Bible story to the Gospel as part of each lesson. Prepare for decision counseling and follow up. Clearly communicate to both leaders and students how the next steps will happen. Who will your counselors be? Where will they go to talk with kids? Make sure they're never out of sight. Pray regularly that the kids in your Beach Club will understand God's plan of salvation and choose to follow Jesus.

Teaching Tip

Designate an area in your teaching space where kids can go to talk with a leader one-on-one. Some clubs call this an "A-B-C Corner." Direct kids to that area after the gospel connection every week.

Gospel Connection

Before you begin, ask if there are any clubbers who would like to talk with the Bible Connection Leader about praying to ask Jesus to become their forever friend. If so, let them go to the designated area.

Today's Lesson

- Why isn't our world perfect today?
- How did Jesus take responsibility for your sin?
- In what ways do you think you can show more <u>responsibility</u> at home or school?

Pray

Father God, help us each to want to follow You. Thank You for loving us and sending Jesus to die for our sins so we can be with You forever. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Use the Bible

Give each child a memory link card. Review today's memory link and character word. Guide kids to use cards to mark today's story in their KBC Study Bibles. Lead them to highlight today's memory link.

Hang 10 Pages

Give each child a Hang 10 Page. Challenge kids to hang out with God 10 minutes each day by praying and reading the Bible, using the Hang 10 page as a guide. Encourage kids to bring back their Hang 10 pages next week.

Let's look at Day 4. Turn to page 575 in your Bible and let's read it together. How can you know God's ways? What do you have that will show you what He wants you to do? Can you unscramble the word? (The Bible)



Teaching Tip

It's always a good idea to come prepared to fill extra time. Give this quick and easy game a try: Sit or Stand. Ask a yes or no question. Each child who answers yes must change positions (stand if they were sitting or sit if they were standing). If the answer is no they remain in the same position.

MAKE IT STICK - REVIEW GAME

Game to review today's Bible Connection & Character Word.

Option 1 - HOPPITY HOP!

No supplies needed

Instruct surf teams to line up single file. Ask surf team leaders to stand several feet away from their teams as the clubbers take turns hopping as directed toward their leader. (Ways to hop: On one foot, on both feet, like a frog, like a bunny, backward.) Once the child reaches their leader, the leader will ask a review question. If the answer is correct, the child may run back to their line and tag the next player who will repeat the process. If a child answers incorrectly, they must hop back to tag the next player. The team answering the most questions correctly wins.

Option 2 - BEACH VOLLEYBALL

Beach ball, jump ropes

Call for two kids or leaders to hold a jump rope shoulder high in the middle of the group. Divide the remaining kids into two teams. Teams will volley a beach ball back and forth over the jump rope. The first team to either allow the ball to hit the ground or hit the ball out of play causes the opposite team a chance to answer a review question and earn points. Award five points for each correct answer. Continue play until all questions have been answered. Calculate points and declare a winner.
